The 'Stihl Timbersports' Series is an extreme sporting competition that sees woodsmen compete against each other and the clock in a series of disciplines based on traditional logging skills using axes and saws.



This follows on the Teams success in the 2018 World Championships held in Liverpool, England. On both occasions the Australian Chopperoos defeated the New Zealanders in the final to secure the Championships event. The Chopperoos are considered the most successful national woodchopping team having won the 'Stihl Timbersports' World Championship for the sixth time.

he Mechanics Institute Committee are pleased to announce that the exterior of the Institute will be given a fresh coat of paint. Work will commence in January. 2020. Brett Kennedy who has recently completed the exterior painting of St David's Church will also be painting the Mechanics Institute. Brett painted the Institute exterior over a decade ago, so the Institute will once again be in his safe hands for its new coat of paint.

The Committee would like to acknowledge and thank the Latrobe City Council for making a project of this scale possible. Funding granted under the Small Towns Minor Capital Works Program will ensure that the Mechanics Institute will continue to look great and be maintained in the condition this historic building deserves for many years to come.

Over the years he Committee have run an Old Time Dance monthly at the Institute on a Friday evening The dances held on the first Friday of each month will take a break over the holiday season. The interior of the Hall looked especially lovely at night with the lights reflecting from the timber flooring and paintwork. The Christmas decorations lend a cheerful and welcoming atmosphere for the dancers who enjoyed their evening. We are really fortunate to have such a beautiful building in our town.

If you should venture upstairs and enter the Lodge Room you will see on display a series of historical photos. Framed in recycled timber obtained when the Mechanics Institute paling fence was replaced they sit comfortably on the timber walls of the Lodge Room. The Toongabbie Primary School Artist in Residence Program 1982. The murals are located in the Toongabbie Recreation Reserve Stadium. A school and community project. Head teacher Margo Warren.

The murals have been painted on APM felt belting used in the manufacture of paper at the mill. The felt was originally hung along the walls of the Stadium to improve the acoustics in the building. Pupils, younger siblings, parents and community members over a 2 week period painted under the direction of the artist Bill Hay.

Since completion in 1982 the Murals hung in the Stadium for a number of years before being taken down and placed in storage whilst refurbishments were completed in the main building. They survived the long term storage remarkably well and have taken up residence once again along the walls of the Stadium. Take the time to look closely there is much to interpret in each of the paintings.

he Toongabbie & District Men's Shed Inc. members have been busy the past few months with a successful stall at the Toongabbie auction, selling some of their wood work, cakes and other produce on the day. Items that are no longer required or utilised by the Shed members were auctioned on the day.

Although passed in on the day of the auction, the Pasquali tractor that was restored by members was successfully sold at a later date, thanks to Stephen Bailey and all members who worked on the project.

Terry Foulds has been organising with other members the construction of a billy cart that can be later assembled by the Glengarry girl scouts as a project. Colin Gardner is organising the refurbishment by the Men's Shed of the cubby houses at the Toongabbie School's playground.

The Men's Shed was kindly donated a 6x4 steel trailer that requires some work to replace the rusted out sections and this will be another project to restore and possibly sell to fund equipment and future projects.

The steel frame and back board sign for the Wellington Latrobe Lions Club is completed and will be erected at the Toongabbie Mechanics Institute Hall, displaying their signage.

The kitchen / meeting room floor coverings will be completed at the Shed thanks to the Minor Capital Works Grant Program by the Latrobe City. The availability of these grants have been very important to the develop-

ment of the Men's Shed. Many thanks to the Latrobe City Council.

Unfortunately we were unsuccessful in our Federal Government Grant Application for ducting to complete the dust extraction system in the Shed. An approach has been made to the Township Group for Small Towns Minor Capital Works Funding. We have been placed on their priority list.

Seeking Community Support for a changed Bus Service

Harry Edtmaier has approached the Latrobe City regarding bus services to and from Traralgon to Glengarry and Toongabbie. While other small townships within the Latrobe Valley such as Boolarra and Yinnar have bus services run by Public Transport Victoria running 7 days a week every two hours, the VLine services that goes through to Maffra run a service not reflective of work timelines. On some days only one bus service running in the morning and one in the evening means that patrons have to spend the day in Traralgon waiting for a return trip.

So in order to get an idea of community support for a changed bus service there will be a form left at the Toongabbie General Store seeking community support and feedback. Together with the information gathered from the Glengarry community it can be presented to Latrobe Council for review and changes implemented.

Scouting Opportunities in Toongabbie

t has been a very busy term for our Glengarry Scout Group. Our hall renovations are complete, (with solar panels) and an official 'Opening Night' will be held early next year.

Our fundraising efforts have seen our Group being able to purchase a trailer for transporting camping gear to activities. Our Scouts attended Gilerro camp this term. Over 2,000 scouts attended this event, participating in crate stacking, air rifle shooting, bubble soccer, challenge valley mud run and more.

Thank you to the Scouts for helping members from the Township Group and Men's Shed put up the Christmas decorations in Toongabbie recently.

Fire Restrictions


The Fire Danger Period for Latrobe City Council will begin at 1am on Monday, 16 December 2019. This means that fires cannot be lit in the open air until the Fire Danger Period finishes, regardless of the weather (eg rain and cooler temperatures does not mean the restrictions are finished).
