Local Cowwarr artist, Jo Caminiti, has completed the first of three scrapmetal sculptures of the Railway Dog for the Gippsland Plains Rail Trail, the "running" dog for Toongabbie. She is now working on the "standing" dog for Glengarry, and the trio will be complete with the "sitting" dog for Cowwarr.

The Rail Trail committee will be constructing plinths and installing the three sculptures at the respective station sites in 2025, in time for the 90th anniversary of the front page article in the Melbourne Herald, "Gippsland's Wonder Dog Believes in Two Means of Locomotion."

Railway Dog

Jo says "it's been quite a challenge convincing piles of rusted scrapmetal to capture the likeness and spirit of the female red kelpie known only as the Railway Dog."

Donations of small items of scrapmetal for the Railway Dog sculptures (retired tools, farm scrap, garden implements, machinery parts, cogs and sprockets, nuts and bolts) can still be made at the Toongabbie Men's Shed from 2 to 5pm on Wednesdays and Fridays.

This is a Gippsland Plains Rail Trail Committee community partnership project with Alinta Energy.

Farewell and Welcome? - Toongabbie Volunteer Shortage




ALAN PAULET *A real shortage of volunteer workers in the Toongabbie – will you help?*
